## FIVE CENTS WORTH

Some weeks ago one of our dear members of Grace Church found himself in the intensive care unit in the hospital. I tried to visit him, but was turned away by the nurse who said that the “patient was sleeping.” After intense, invasive surgery, sleep is necessary for the body to recover and heal. But the same result happened the next day, so I asked the volunteer guarding the ICU door if the nurse ever woke the patient to take his “vital signs.” Pointing to my private communion kit, I explained that I had something vital to share with the patient. To make a long story short, I finally caught up with the patient four days later in a different room and we communed together.

**Vital** is the word that Jesus attaches to the Church’s ministry. Physical, mental, and spiritual wholeness is God’s intended result for all created life, and the Bible understands human life as the integration of all three aspects of being alive. Especially in the Old Testament, the word for “soul” (‘nephesh’) can be translated as “the human being, body-mind-spirit, who is alive to God.” If any one of the three elements is missing, the person is either dead or a desultory wreck. In Yiddish such a person is called a ‘nebbish.’ In my former life as a cartoonist I drew ‘nebbishes’, sometimes wearing a clerical collar. It is true: “you gotta have soul!”

Vitality in the Church is a sign of the Spirit’s presence, a testimony to the fact that we have received the divine life-breath that moves and motivates us to “seek first the kingship of God.” That life-breath of the Spirit is evident when we share the Christian faith in acts of love. It is evident in the Rite of Confirmation and in the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist. It is evident when we pray and when we praise God. It is blowing strong when we gather together to call a pastor to serve as a shepherd of the Grace flock. It is a vitality needed to reach out to the U of O campus and instill in the students of Life School.

When I step into the hospital room I am immediately confronted with a tangle of tubes and machines hooked up to the patient, measuring medical drips and vital signs. I’m sometimes intimidated by the medical technology I don’t understand. There I stand, possessing only a prayer and the Word, but they insure a vital connection between us and the presence of God. There in that antiseptic room God is present, enlivening the soul, nourishing the human spirit, affirming that we are indeed children of God.

## From the Call Committee

At noon on Sunday, June 6, our congregation will hold a Call Service. This will be much more than a “normal” Voters’ Meeting. Pastor John Luther, acting as our Circuit Advisor, will conduct the gathering. The purpose: to call the next pastor of Grace Lutheran Church.

We have printed information on the five people who are on our call list. If you have not yet received a copy of this information, please pick up a copy from the church office or after church services on May 30. It will also be available on June 6, though we hope that you will have a chance to read it (and pray over it!) before the meeting.

Calling a pastor to serve our church is serious business. The first page of the Call Document is the Diploma of Vocation which reads:

*In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.*

*To [name of pastor we elect]*

*Having called on the Lord, our God, for guidance and in the exercise of the authority with which He has vested His church on earth, we, the members of [Grace Lutheran Church of Eugene] have elected you to the office of Pastor and herewith extend to you this formal notification of your solemn call.*

*In the name of the Triune God and by His authority we ask you to assume the responsibilities of the office to which we have called you and faithfully to perform all of the duties of your office according to the Word of God and the confessional standards of the Evangelical Lutheran Church as drawn from the Sacred Scriptures and found in the Book of Concord. We ask you to do this according to the needs as specified in the accompanying document or as may be resolved and mutually agreed upon from time to time. To the end that you may be enabled to do this, we pledge you our wholehearted and continuing cooperation and support in word and deed and in our prayers to God in your behalf.*

*We pray God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has moved us to extend our call to you, to convince you by His Holy Spirit that it comes from Him; to induce you to accept it; to conduct you safely in your field of labor; and to bless you ministrations to the glory of His holy name, the building of His church, the temporal and eternal welfare of many people, and your own great joy and blessing.*

[Signed on—we hope—June 6 on behalf of the congregation]

*In the name of the Triune God and by His authority, in order that we might carry out His mission to the world, we hereby authorize and obligate you:*

- *To administer to us the Word of God in its full truth and purity as contained in the Sacred Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and as set forth in the confessional writings of the Evangelical Lutheran Church as found in the Book of Concord.*
- *To administer the holy sacraments in accordance with their divine institution;*
- *To demonstrate the mind and spirit of Christ as you serve the members of the congregation and equip them for Christ’s mission to seek and save the lost;*

- To equip and enable the members of the congregation to serve one another and those outside the fellowship of the congregation;
- To perform the functions of a pastor in an evangelical manner; to aid, counsel, and guide members of all ages and social conditions; to visit the sick and the dying; to admonish the indifferent and the erring; to support the members of the congregation as they extend that evangelical ministry to others;
- To guard and promote faithfully the spiritual welfare of the members of this congregation, in particular to see to the instruction of the catechumens, both children and adults, in the Word and thus prepare them for communicant membership in the church;
- To guide the congregation in applying the divinely ordained discipline of the church according to the Word of God and to assist and lead the members of the congregation in practicing the forgiven life with one another;
- To promote and guide the mission activity of the congregation as it is related to the local community and to endeavors of the Synod and its Districts, in particular to train workers and guide them in evangelism and to enlist the support of the congregation for mission work;
- To serve as a resource and guide for members of the congregation as they participate in the ministry of Christian education, and to train parents to teach the Christian faith to their children;
- To assist the congregation in adopting administrative policies and procedures that will help it carry out the mission of a Christian congregation;
- To serve the congregation as an example of Christian conduct; to endeavor earnestly to live in Christian unity with the members of the congregation, fellow workers, and sister congregations in the Synod; and by the grace of God to do everything possible for the edification of the congregation and the upbuilding of the church of Christ.

Please note that the congregation also takes on obligations to the pastor:

*As the baptized people of God we partner with you to accomplish His mission to the world, and we hereby obligate ourselves:*

- To receive you as a servant of Jesus Christ, to give you the honor and love and obedience that the Word prescribes, to aid you by word and deed, and to support you with our diligent, faithful assistance and prayers;
- To make faithful and regular use of the means of grace;
- To work with you to equip God's people to glorify Him and extend His kingdom by living out our baptism;
- To make appropriate arrangements for your continuing education as a professional person in the ministry of the Gospel;
- To provide for your proper maintenance according to our ability and to review your salary, housing arrangements, and all allowances periodically, beginning with the following arrangements: (details follow about specific compensation).

We hope all members will prayerfully consider each person on the call list, then attend the Call Service on June 6 and help us elect a pastor. Please continue to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance in all of our deliberations. We are in good hands when we rely on God!

## SERVICE OF PRAYER AND ANOINTING

**On the fourth Sunday of each month** we will hold a semi-private service of prayer and anointing for those who have health concerns. This will be held following the close of the worship service. Those who would like anointing of oil and prayers for the sick should come to the front pews. Pastor Nickel will join you after greeting people at the door following worship.

School kits help parents continue their children's education, even while living in a refugee camp, for example. A school kit may also be used in adult literacy classes. If you would prefer to give a donation rather than shop for supplies OR if you would like to contribute to the cost of postage (which is @ \$250.00), please **make out check to Grace Lutheran LWML** with a notation for school supplies or postage. Below are the items needed for the school kits. There will be a box in the narthex to collect the supplies. If you have any questions, contact Jean Harsch.

### Items needed for each school kit:

- \* 2 or 3 - Padded or spiral notebooks of ruled paper (approx. 8½" x 11" totaling 150-200 sheets) – please NO loose-leaf paper
- \* 1 - Blunt Scissors
- \* 1 - 30-centimeter Ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- \* Pencil sharpener
- \* 6 – new, unsharpened #2 Pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band (no colored pencils and all one color, preferably yellow)
- \* 1 – Eraser approximately 2-1/2" long
- \* 12 Sheets of construction paper in assorted colors
- \* 1 – Box of 16 or 24 Crayons

## Life Journey Ministries West Coast Conference – June 25-26, 2010 –

Clearly understanding how the Christian faith changes us as individuals as well as the work we do and the places in which we work will be the focus of the Life Journey Ministries’ west-coast conference to be held June 25-26 at Concordia University, Portland, OR under the theme: “Being Sunday People in a Monday World.” William Young, author of *The Shack*, will speak Friday evening on the question “Can God Really Be That Good?”

The two-day conference, starting at 2pm on Friday and ending at 6pm on Saturday, will delve into many exciting topics including these conference workshops on Friday: *Seeing Christ in the Workplace*; *Environmentalism: The New Spirituality*; and *Finding Meaning in the Face of Fear and Uncertainty*. A few of the break out sessions on Saturday include *Balancing Work and Personal Life*, *Legal Aspects Related to Faith in the Workplace* and *Work through the Eyes of Different Generations*. In addition to being a pastor’s wife, mother and grandmother, she has worked as a volunteer in poverty ridden communities. Carolyn holds masters degrees in both ministry and organization management.
